Approach to Pilcot Green Posts – Summary of Discussions So Far

A paper (106-20) was agreed by the Council in August, which suggested the painting & repair of the fencing around Pilcot Green South.

In November, the tender document was agreed in principle, subject to the insurance approach, but with it was also agreed that we should wait for the appropriate time of year for the work to be done.

Undate

Prior to the January meeting we have approached two different contractors (Kate Buckland – recommended by Rotherwick Council; and Cliff Reading – recommended by the contractor who has worked on Ormersfield House) to get their views on a) the indicative costs of the project, b) their judgement of the level of insurance they had and would need and c) their view of the best time of year to do the project.

Both contractors were of the view that the project was best completed in late Spring / early Summer once the wood was dry. They were also of the view that they would not need to be on the road to complete the job. They felt they had the appropriate level of insurance for the job, but neither were able to confirm that they had public liability insurance upto £10m.

Kate Buckland stated that indicatively treating and painting the posts would cost $^{\sim}$ £750 and replacing the chain would be $^{\sim}$ £500 (ex VAT). Cliff Reading has stated that indicatively treating and painting the posts would cost $^{\sim}$ £680 and replacing the chain would be $^{\sim}$ £590 (ex VAT).

At the January meeting it was agreed we would update the tender document to allow for the potential use of a rope rather than a chain, and that we would put out to three parties. It went out on 15th February to Kate Buckland, Cliff Reading and Goslings (who have worked in the Parish before) with a request for a response by 15th March.

We have received one formal response (from Goslings) who have quote £685 + VAT to remove chain & dispose in skip at our yard; clear round posts, paint with 3 coats of white Weathershield; and supply & install 5mm thick black coated chain into posts. No formal responses have been received from the other two parties despite chasing. Goslings have also confirmed that they could start within the month, and could reduce the charge "a small amount" if we moved from the chain to the rope solution.

I have also followed up with Landlord at the Queen's Head. He has confirmed that he would be happy to share (and potentially cover) the cost of getting the fence improved, and believes it could be done at a significantly cheaper cost than the above with contractors he knows. He was proposing painting the chain (rather than replacing it) and the fences.

If the Council is happy I would recommend that we safeguard Council funds for other matters and work with The Queen's Head on a solution for the fence at Pilcot Green South.


APPENDIX: SCHEDULE OF WORK - PILCOT GREEN FENCE

Proposals are requested for renovating the fence that bounds two sides of Pilcot Green South, which is marked in yellow on the map overleaf and is located alongside the Queen's Head Public House in the centre of Dogmersfield. The fence is close to wooden tables used by the public house and the area is usually busy around the start and end of every school day.

The fence consists of 29 wooden posts spaced over a distance of approximately 50 metres and threaded with rusty ferrous chain. The posts measure approximately 800mm x 100mm x 100mm and are generally firmly bedded. Some have been previously painted white while others have probably never been painted. The unprotected tops of the posts have become susceptible to damp due to the open grain. The fence is situated a little under one metre from the edge of the road.








The requirement is as follows:

- To remove the existing chains and dispose of them responsibly.
- To trim back the grass around the base of the posts to facilitate the repainting.
- To straighten any non-vertical posts and steady any loose posts using wedges.
- To prepare the posts for painting as appropriate, including application of a suitable treatment to the top of each post to provide resistance to water penetration. The contractor is required to propose the means of achieving this.
- To apply sufficient coats of paint to give a durable, high-quality white gloss finish.
- To supply and securely fit black-coated metallic chain using existing holes drilled in the posts. The contractor is required to take measurements to determine the precise length of chain required. The chain should be similar in construction to that currently fitted (5mm gauge with 45mm x 25mm loops). To also quote for the replacement of the chain with either a plastic chain or a rope.

It is the contractor's responsibility to suggest any changes in the above scope required to maximise durability of the finish.

The contractor is required to:

- Supply all tools and materials.
- Specify how they will work safely in the proximity of the road.
- Specify how they will protect members of the public from all hazards arising from the work, including protecting them from transfer of wet paint to clothing.
- Specify any warranties that will apply to the work.
