Jane's Cottage (22/02423/FUL)

An appeal was lodged by the applicant which failed validation at the Inspectorate since HDC had not included the reasons for refusal in their decision meaning that the original planning decision was not legally valid. It is unclear how this will move forward, and it will be monitored.

23/149 To update members on any new planning consultations, appeals and enforcements

3/00823/FUL 22/01457/EIA And 22/01997/EIA Land at Ormersfield Farm, Crondall Road - Installation of a battery energy storage system with associated infrastructure and works including access to the public highway

HDC has received additional information regarding drainage, biodiversity, landscaping and safety. The main issue is regarding fire safety with Hampshire Fire Service wanting (inter alia) better (dual) access to the site together with information on battery chemistry and safety systems before planning is approved; the applicant says dual access is impossible and is suggesting a compromise solution and wanting to delay submitting technical details of the batteries and safety systems until after planning has been approved and deal with them as a planning condition.

DPC objected to the original application on 18 May 2022. Very few of the matters raised have been dealt with so far.

In summary DPC should reissue an objection referring back to the original objection, commenting that fire safety is paramount, supporting the views of HFS and commenting that a matter of such importance should be dealt with before a decision is made on the application and not as a condition.


23/150 To update members on Highways and approve any actions

Repair and Replace Dogmersfield white signs - Cllr Miles reports that Ian Janes from Highways has suggested they may be able to support on the village signs, either repair or replace, however this cannot be done until 2025/26 due to the 2024 budget already being allocated.

Overgrown trees across the parish - Cllr Miles shared the below OPS map of Dogmersfield. Highways have mapped out the area that are under highway's jurisdiction in pink. They have confirmed they are responsible for the pink areas, however they do not own the common land shown in green.

Options were discussed to maintain the area - DPC and residents to continue to enter all overgrown and problem trees into the Highway portal, or to commission a lengthsman to cut the problem area back.





ACTION – Cllr Miles to investigate who has the rights to the common land.

Unofficial Layby – this is still being investigated and options to see what can be done about protecting the infill.

SID – The SID was turned off but keep recording the speeds, it was reported that the vehicles were travelling on average around 2.5 miles per hour faster without the SID flashing.

Below are the two areas that Cllr Miles would like to discuss at the APA for potential CFI (Community Funded) projects-

Parking on Chatter Alley – The most likely option is to put white H bars in front of the houses, this option is not legally enforceable.

Parking at the canal bridge – Option is to put in dragons' teeth.

One member of the public has concerns about putting in Dragon's teeth, as this would make turning exceedingly difficult for agricultural vehicles

Cllr Fillis would also like to add another Sign further up the village with CFI, also to be discussed at the APA.
